Terms and Conditions

In these terms and conditions 'the Council' means the Cassowary Coast Regional Council.

- 1. Information on how to enter and participate in the Love Food Hate Waste Challenge including all challenge communications and resources form part of these terms and conditions of entry. Participation in the challenge will be considered acceptance of these terms and conditions.
- 2. The Council (ABN 20 889 787 211) is the administrator of the Love Food Hate Waste Challenge
- 3. Late, partially completed or registrations that do not satisfy the registration requirements may be judged as ineligible for participation in the challenge
